Dear friends,

The beginning of a new year provides the opportunity to reflect on the progress of the past 12 months, If you've been watching cable TV, you might think that every waking moment of 2019 in Washington has been consumed by divisive, partisan issues – and while there's no shortage of those debates, there have also been opportunities for bipartisan cooperation. You sent me to the Senate to make the most of those opportunities, so as we enter into the New Year, I wanted to take a moment to update you on my efforts to work with members of both parties to make life better for the people of Maine.

One of my most important priorities this past year has been emphasizing preventive healthcare. Maine's distinction as the oldest state in the nation brings us wisdom, of course – but it also creates unique challenges, particularly relating to healthcare. The key to addressing these obstacles is being proactive, because the cheapest, safest medical procedure is the one that doesn't need to happen. That's why I've introduced legislation to incentivize healthier living, expand mental health screenings, and help more Americans access regular check-ups. We're making progress, but we've got a long way to go – and I'd like your help, because I know that the best ideas are the ones that come from families and communities on the front lines of these challenges. To strengthen this effort, I convened a policy forum on prevention in Bangor in October, which has already given me exciting new ideas that I'll carry with me into 2020. If you have additional thoughts on encouraging preventive healthcare, please share them with my office.

This year has also continued the growth of Maine's forest products industry – a key focus of my work to revitalize Maine's rural economy and communities. We've seen significant investment in mills across the state, creating good jobs to support rural Maine. I'm also pleased that the investments aren't just in our mills – the industry is thriving because of its commitment to innovation. We're fortunate to have the University of Maine's top-notch researchers exploring cutting-edge ways to use our forest resources, including capitalizing on the rise of 3D printing technology with the world's largest 3D printer. Combining this work with ongoing federal support, our vast forests, and Maine's dedicated workforce, I know that the future of this industry is bright, and I'll continue working to support it on all fronts.

I'm proud of all we've accomplished together this year, but even as I reflect on all that we've achieved, it is challenging to not think of the work left undone. It sometimes can be discouraging to watch these important priorities hang in limbo, but fortunately for me, encouragement is never far. After all, I get to live in Maine – which means I get to count Maine people as my neighbors and friends. I'm always struck by the kindness that our citizens show not only to me, but also to each other. This focus on collaboration and compassion is an inspiration, and it powers my efforts bring a little bit of Maine common sense to Washington. Thank you for all you do to for our state – Mary and I are deeply grateful, and we hope that 2020 will be a good year for you, your family, your community, and the State of Maine.

Dear Friends,

As 2019 ends and 2020 begins, I am pleased to report that Congress made progress on a number of issues important to Maine families despite the polarization in our country.

In a major win for surviving military and retiree spouses to whom we are deeply indebted, I was proud to co-lead the repeal of what is often referred to as the "Military Widow's Tax," an unfair offset of survivor benefits that has prevented as many as 67,000 surviving spouses—including more than 260 from Maine—from receiving the full benefits they deserve.

The high cost of health care and prescription drugs continues to be a top issue for families and seniors. To provide continued relief for more lower- and middle-income individuals, I led the charge to extend for another two years the medical expense tax deduction that I included in the 2017 tax law. Without this extension, nearly 20,000 Mainers and millions of Americans with high medical expenses, including many with preexisting conditions, would have faced an increased tax burden. In other good news, the CREATES Act I cosponsored became law. It will prevent pharmaceutical companies from blocking access to a sufficient supply of brand-name drugs needed for the studies that allow less expensive alternatives to enter the marketplace.

Improving people's health and wellbeing remains my priority. On a per capita basis, Maine has the highest incidence of Lyme disease in the country. In August, I held a Senate hearing at the University of Maine's Tick Lab on this growing public health crisis. A comprehensive public health strategy to combat this epidemic is needed, and the new law I authored will do just that.

In addition, I helped champion another \$2.6 billion increase for the National Institutes of Health, our nation's premiere biomedical research institution, including significant boosts for Alzheimer's disease and diabetes research. Last year, NIH funded more than \$111 million for research at 14 Maine institutions.

To help prepare the graduates of Maine Maritime Academy, I secured \$300 million for a new training ship, which will ensure rigorous instruction for MMA students for decades to come.

Significant federal funding was approved for work at Bath Iron Works and Portsmouth Naval Shipyard. Funding appropriated by Congress will pay for three new destroyers, make a down payment on an additional ship, and finance infrastructure improvements at PNSY.

As Chairman of the Transportation and Housing Appropriations Subcommittee, I have led efforts to improve our nation's crumbling infrastructure and ensure that Maine's housing needs are addressed. For Maine's roads, bridges, airports, and seaports, tens of millions in federal funding will help make urgently needed upgrades and improve safety. Funding will also support housing assistance to low-income families and seniors and aid communities in reducing homelessness among our youth. The Community Development Block Grant program will assist numerous towns and cities in our State.

The Aging Committee I chair has continued its focus on financial security for our seniors. A new law I authored will make it easier for small businesses to offer retirement plans to their employees. Our Aging Committee's Fraud Hotline fielded more than 1,200 calls this year. Congress passed a new law to crack down on robocallers who are often the perpetrators of these scams. And a new law I authored will expand the IRS' Identity Protection PIN program nationwide to prevent identity theft tax refund fraud.

At the end of 2019, I cast my 7,262nd consecutive vote. In the New Year, I will keep working to deliver bipartisan solutions to the challenges facing Maine and the nation. Dear Friends,

I hope this letter finds you well. It is an immense honor to serve as your representative in Congress. I take very seriously the responsibility that has been placed on me, and I would like to take this opportunity to share with you some of what I've been working on in my first year in Congress.

At the beginning of this term, the House passed H.R. 1, a comprehensive package of reforms I cosponsored to get big money out of politics and fight corruption in Washington. And in December, I helped pass H.R. 3, the *Lower Drug Costs Now Act*, which would limit out-of-pocket prescription drug costs paid by seniors, fund the expansion of Medicare coverage to include dental, vision, and hearing, and lower prescription drug prices for thousands of Mainers. Additionally, as a member of the House Armed Services Committee, I worked to ensure our annual defense authorization bill supports America's national security and Maine's shipyard workers, National Guardsmen, manufacturers, and universities.

On top of working on this legislation, I have also been advocating for our district directly to administrative agencies. I have been fighting for Maine lobstermen to urge the president to intervene in proposed regulations by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) that would hurt our lobster industry. I pressed government agencies to ground their regulations in sound science and data when crafting new regulations on Maine's lobstermen. I also persuaded the Army Corps of Engineers to hold a public hearing in Maine about the proposed Central Maine Power NECEC transmission line, which gave hundreds of people the opportunity to voice their opinions about the project.

Some of the most important work of members of Congress is rooted in on-the-ground constituent services. We have three offices in the district -- in Caribou, Bangor, and Lewiston -- and my staff work tirelessly to help Mainers solve problems they may face with federal government agencies. I urge you to stop by to talk to us in person and let us know how we can better serve you and your communities.

My favorite part of the job is coming home to the district and hearing about what matters to you. This year, I brought a hearing of the House Small Business Subcommittee on Contracting and Infrastructure to Maine to find ways to expand access to rural broadband. I've also held open town halls and coffee hours throughout the district to hear directly from Mainers veterans, as well as roundtables to find more ways to help small businesses in Maine grow and create jobs.

As always, please continue to reach out to me and my staff if you'd like to voice an opinion, let us know about a local event, or seek any assistance with federal agencies.

Dear Friends and Residents of Frankfort,

I serve in the Maine Senate to break down barriers to success in Waldo County. Last year, we made progress on the issues that impact Mainers every day: Property tax relief; access to reliable, high-speed internet; local training for local jobs; support for our veterans and first responders; access to affordable health care; and prescription drug costs.

We passed a bipartisan budget that provides \$130 million in property tax relief without raising taxes. That includes a new program to provide a check for at least \$100 to every household that qualified for the Homestead Exemption by April 1, 2019.

The budget also includes \$4 million to expand access to reliable, high-speed internet and \$2.5 million for career and technical education. This year, I am introducing a bill for \$15 million to expand internet access and another for \$4 million to fund career and technical education.

Maine will now join several other states in allowing police officers who have served in the military to wear veterans' insignia on their uniforms. This change, which I sponsored, will recognize veterans when they come home and help them better connect with other veterans in their communities.

We also worked to make health care more affordable and more accessible. We passed laws to require insurance companies to cover hearing aids, protect coverage for those with preexisting conditions and lower prescription drug costs.

Thank you for the opportunity to continue to serve the residents of Frankfort in the 129th Legislature. I am honored to represent our town in the halls of Augusta this session.

Last year, we increased funding for the Earned Income Tax Credit, a credit that puts money in the pockets of hard working Mainers. Our bipartisan state budget increased the Homestead Exemption and expanded the Property Tax Fairness Credit, two programs that help homeowners and renters keep their housing costs in check. The budget also increased state revenue sharing, sending more money to our communities to offset the cost of things like plowing, paving and public safety.

As a member of the Legislature's Labor and Housing Committee, I am committed to bringing your voices to the table as we get to work ensuring that workers are treated fairly and Maine families have access to safe, affordable housing. I know there is so much we can do to make life better for the residents of our state.

Whether we are dealing with the above issues or any other topic, I will continue to work with all of my colleagues, regardless of party affiliation, to make sure we're doing the best work we can for the people of our district and all the people of Maine.

Citizens of Waldo County,

The Members of the Waldo County Sheriff's Office are proud to serve the citizens of our great County. We want to thank the members of the public for their continued support. We are a full service Sheriff's Office providing Law Enforcement, Corrections and Civil Paperwork Service to folks who live, work and visit Waldo County.

Some highlights of 2019 included the use of body cameras for the Patrol Deputies. The body cameras are enhancing our accountability to the public, evidence collection and our ability to critique deputy performance. In the Corrections Division, we entered into an inmate boarding contract with the Somerset County Sheriff's Office, saving \$170,000 in the first year. We also increased our collaboration with the Knox County Sheriff's Office by sharing our Jail Administrator saving additional taxpayer funds in both Counties.

Our patrol division handled 8,376 calls for service in 2019. These calls included all types of incidents from murders, domestic violence, robberies, burglaries, thefts, child abuse, sexual abuse, drug overdoses, and much more. The drug abuse epidemic continues to ravage our citizens and cause much of the crime in our county. The patrol division also conducted 2,056 traffic stops throughout the county in an effort to increase traffic safety on our roads and highways.

Our Corrections Division continues to excel in the operation of the Maine Coastal Regional Re-entry Center serving 62 residents in 2019. These are men who were nearing the end of their term of incarceration. Our many programs assist them with their integration back into society as productive and contributing citizens. During their stay at the re-entry center, residents provided 10,053 hours of community service throughout Waldo County. This translated

to \$110,585 in free labor to citizens and non-profit agencies. Residents also provided more than 153,000 pounds of fresh vegetables to local food pantries and those in need from the County's Garden Project overseen by Waldo County Commissioner William Shorey. The residents also paid \$29,105 in room and board to the County.

The 72 hour holding and booking facility processed 727 persons who were arrested in Waldo County by all the law enforcement agencies serving our County. If a person who has been arrested cannot make bail within 72 hours, he or she has to be transported to the Somerset County Jail in East Madison by our Transport Division. Our average daily population of Waldo County prisoners held at Somerset was 22 men and women. This along with bringing prisoners to court and medical appointments, generated 387 transports with our transport division, traveling more than 67,444 miles in 2019.

Our Civil Service Division served 1,840 sets of legal paperwork all over the County in 2019.

It has been an honor for all of us to be of service to the citizens of Waldo County in 2019. We look forward to a safe and productive 2020.

The West Frankfort Fire Department wishes to express our appreciation for the support we have received from the residents of Frankfort. We would also like to thank Searsport Fire Department for their donations of trucks and equipment over the years. We also wish to thank Searsport Ambulance for training our members in first aid and CPR at no cost to the department.

I would like to remind everyone that fighting fires in today's structures is much different than it was 30 or 40 years ago. The gases given off by newer building materials and furniture are highly toxic. When entering a burning building it is often difficult to know what we may encounter, from illegal drugs to loaded weapons.

Nationwide it is becoming an issue to recruit volunteer firefighters. We ask these volunteers to meet stricter and more extensive training requirements with annual refreshers to maintain those requirements. We also ask them to respond to calls, sometimes risking life and limb, at all hours of the day and night. This often requires them to leave work, family events, holidays, anniversaries, and other personal time for no compensation. When the fire has been extinguished much of the work is just beginning. The firefighters must fuel the trucks, fill the tanks, clean tools, replace hose, and make their equipment ready for the next call.

Last year the West Frankfort Fire Department responded to a variety of 9-1-1 calls including structure fires, wildland fires, chimney fires, smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, car accidents, lift assists and CPR assists for the Ambulance. We have used our Jaws of Life twice and they are a great addition to our rescue tools. We are able to fill our SCBA bottles in-house saving the time and expense of having to transport them somewhere else to be filled. We also fill SCBA bottles for other departments as well.

We are always looking for new members to join the team. Also, we want to remind everyone that we have smoke alarms available to Frankfort residents if you need them in your home. You can contact West Frankfort Fire Chief Roy Stone at (207) 322-3044 for an application or for information on the smoke alarms.

In 2019 our department responded to 50 emergency calls. One of those calls was a mutual aid call. If you have an emergency please remember to dial 911.

I want to personally thank everyone that volunteered their time to help us do work on and around our station or made donations without putting any burden on taxpayers. There are a lot of man hours that goes into training, fighting fires, accident scenes, and maintenance on the building, equipment and trucks as well as fundraising which is greatly appreciated.

In 2019 we purchased and installed a newer furnace complete with duct work. We moved the furnace to a centralized location and built a room around it. We finally finished the vinyl siding. All we have left to do outside is metal wrap the wood trim and finish the roof trim.

We purchased with left over grant money a GMC K3500 4X4 pickup and added a fiberglass cap. We have our vehicle extrication equipment, AED and lifeflight landing lights along with other rescue equipment on this truck. It will also be used for fighting wild fires. Over the next few years we will have to replace our air pack bottles we received with our 2007 FEMA grant as they are getting to the end of their life. We received a \$2000 Maine Municipal Grant to help with the purchase of four new air pack bottles in early 2020.

We continue to use the Waldo County Firefighters Association's training building in Waldo for training along with in house training. We have one new member attending basic fire school in early 2020.

We would like to thank all of our sponsors who donated to purchase the six flag poles that our department installed at the Veteran's Memorial Garden. We would like to thank everyone who helped clean out the trees and debris from Marsh Stream above the dam in the spring.

GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the voters of the Town of Frankfort, in said County, qualified by law to vote in the Town of Frankfort, to meet at the Frankfort Town Office in said Town of Frankfort, on Thursday the 26th March 2020, at nine in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles to wit:

- Article 1: To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Article 2: To choose, by secret ballot, according to the Revised Statues, one Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor and Assessor for a three year term, one Road Commissioner for a one year term, one Planning Board Member for a five year term, and one Planning Board Member for a three year term.
- Article 3: To choose by secret ballot, according to the Revised Statues, one Referendum question; Shall the Town of Frankfort vote to eliminate the Town High Department and privatize plowing/sanding and road work? YES OR NO
- Article 4: To choose by secret ballot, according to the Revised Statutes, one Referendum question; Shall the Town of Frankfort borrow funds in the amount of \$1,000,000.00 to repair and pave roads in Frankfort with a 10 year bond? YES OR NO Roads to be repaired and paved: Averill St., Old Belfast Rd., Black Hill Rd., Town Hill Rd., Treat Point Rd., Adams Rd., Lake Rd., and Mt. Waldo Rd.
- Article 5: To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following proposal to wit: That upon completion of action on Article 3 of this Warrant, the meeting will adjourn to meet at Wagner School in Winterport, Friday, March 27, 2020 at 7:00 pm in the evening, to act upon the remaining articles in this Warrant.

The polls will open at nine o'clock in the forenoon and will close at eight o'clock in the evening on the 26th day of March 2020.

Article 6:

To see if the Town will vote to increase the property tax levy limit, established for Frankfort by state law, in the event that the municipal budget approved at this town meeting will result in a tax commitment that is greater than the property tax limit.

Must vote by Secret Ballot

Article 7:

To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Municipal Officers to spend an amount not to exceed 3/12 of the budgeted amount in each budget category of the 2019 annual budget during the period from January 1, 2021to the 2021 Annual Town Meeting, or act thereon.
