

Dear Friends:

It is an honor to represent Maine in the U.S. Senate. I am grateful for the trust that Mainers have placed in me and welcome this opportunity to share some key accomplishments for our state.

Last year, I secured more than \$500 million for 285 projects from Aroostook County to York County that will promote job creation, workforce training, and economic development; expand access to health care; improve public safety, infrastructure, and community resources; and protect our environment. To address the crisis of soaring inflation and high energy prices, I led efforts to provide \$2 billion in supplemental funds to the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program. In the new Congress that begins in 2023, I expect to be the Vice Chairman of the Appropriations Committee and will continue to champion investments to support Maine's communities and families.

Strengthening our economy and supporting good jobs remain a top priority. Along with the Governor and the rest of the Maine Delegation and the associations representing the lobster industry, I worked to protect our hardworking lobstermen and women by pausing for six years the onerous federal regulations that jeopardize our lobster fishery's very existence. Another ongoing threat to Maine's small businesses is the shortage of workers. That's why I led an effort to push the Administration to nearly double the number of H-2B visas that are critical to our hospitality industry. Additionally, when the Administration proposed to cut the construction of a destroyer to be built by Bath Iron Works, I restored this funding to protect Maine jobs and our national security.

When Maine Veterans' Homes announced last year that it planned to close its facilities in Caribou and Machias, I opposed that decision which would have had such a devastating effect on rural veterans and their families. I am glad that the decision was reversed, and I have secured \$3 million to help with upgrades to these facilities. My AUTO for Vets Act also became law, which will help disabled veterans maintain their independence by supporting the purchase of a new adaptive vehicle once a decade.

This past year, Congress demonstrated how effective it can be on behalf of the American people when both parties work together. A few of the bipartisan achievements that I was involved in include the *Respect for Marriage Act*, which will provide certainty to millions of loving couples in same-sex marriages while protecting religious liberties, and the *Electoral Count Reform Act*, which establishes clear guidelines for our system of certifying and counting electoral votes for President and Vice President.

No one works harder than the people of Maine, and I have honored that work ethic by showing up for every vote. During my Senate service, I have cast more than 8,500 consecutive votes, never having missed one. I remain committed to doing all that I can to address your community's concerns in 2023. If I may be of assistance to you in any way, I encourage you to contact one of my six state offices.

Citizens of Waldo County,

The Members of the Waldo County Sheriff's Office are proud to serve the citizens of our great County. We want to thank the members of the public for their continued support. We are a full-service Sheriff's Office providing Law Enforcement, Corrections and Civil Paperwork Service to those who live, work, and visit Waldo County.

Our patrol division handled 8,944 calls for service in 2022. These calls included all types of incidents from murders, domestic violence, robberies, burglaries, thefts, child abuse, sexual abuse, drug overdoses, and much more. The patrol division also conducted 1,659 traffic stops throughout the county in an effort to increase traffic safety on our roads and highways.

Our corrections division finished its thirteenth year in the operation of our 72-hour intake and the Maine Coastal Regional Re-entry Center. The men who participated in the programming of the re-entry center were nearing the end of their term of incarceration. Our many programs assist them with their integration back into society as productive and contributing citizens. During their stay at the re-entry center, residents provided 2,958 hours of community service throughout Waldo County. This translated to a savings in labor costs of \$40,820 to citizens and non-profit agencies. Residents also provided more than 40,000 pounds of fresh vegetables to local food pantries and those in need from the County's Garden Project overseen by Waldo County Commissioner William Shorey. The residents also paid \$21,312.00 dollars in room and board to the County.

The seventy-two-hour holding and booking facility processed 757 persons who were arrested in Waldo County by all the law enforcement agencies serving our County. If a person who has been arrested cannot make bail within 72 hours, he or she has to be transported to the Knox County Jail in Rockland by our Transport Division. Our average daily population of Waldo County prisoners held at the Knox County Jail was 23 men and women. This along with bringing prisoners to court and medical appointments, generated 246 transports with our transport division, traveling more than 35,392 miles in 2022.

Our Civil Service Division served 1,388 sets of legal paperwork all over the County in 2022.

It has been an honor for all of us to be of service to the citizens of Waldo County in 2022. In my first year as your newly elected Sheriff, it is my intention to focus the resources of the Sheriff's Office on enhancing traffic safety and addressing substance abuse. These issues and the associated criminal behavior associated with them impact the quality of life of everyone in Waldo County. We look forward to providing the citizens of Waldo County with Professional law enforcement services based on our core values of Integrity, Teamwork and Compassion. We wish everyone a safe and productive 2023.

To: The Taxpayers and Citizens of Frankfort From: The Swan Lake Dam Committee January 19, 2023

It has been a very busy and productive year 2022 at the Swan Lake Dam.

- 1. Thanks to the leak repair work that was done in the fall of 2021, we were able to maintain reasonably good water levels all summer despite the very dry conditions.
- 2. In April, we had a State inspection of the dam as we will be under State control if and when (it's been two years now) the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission releases its' control. The inspection report resulted in a new dam classification. The old FERC classification was "low hazard" while the new State classification is "significant potential hazard". This classification means if there was a major breach of the dam, there is the potential for flooding and property damage. It is not a reflection on the condition of the dam but rather the possible issues if there was a breach. The report also recommended that there should be an operation and maintenance plan as well as a provision in the Town's Emergency Action Plan to address a dam breach. The design and construction details for new gates had to be submitted prior to installation. All these recommendations were successfully completed. The final recommendation for an engineering study of the dam has not been completed to date.
- 3. The most obvious change at the dam is the three new gates that were installed this fall. As one can imagine, there was a great deal of time spent on 'what needs to be done', 'what type of gate to use', 'who to do the install', and 'how to pay for it all'. The Dam Committee took care of the first three items and First Select Person Cindy Boguen took care of the fourth matter with her diligent pursuit of the American Recovery Act funds. The installation work went pretty much as planned with no major issues. We did find the need to replace the lower half of the trash rack as the old one was in really bad condition. Many thanks to gate manufacturer Whipp's ,Inc., Scofield and Sons, for their prompt response with a new trash gate, and finally, Rich Calligan and his crew from Calligan Dive Service for all their time and work to complete the installation.
- 4. A survey of the dam property has been requested but not completed and we have acquired a new pic/hook pole and a rake to clean out the material that gathers in front of the trash gate.

We continue to monitor the water level on a regular basis and review the water flow reports supplied by the Belfast Water District. The ability to control the lake water level is now greatly improved with the completed repairs and it is the goal of the Dam Committee to maintain good consistent levels in the summer and lower less destructive levels in the winter. The Dam Committee has been a very active and involved group whom deserve a special thanks. The members are: Bruce Mailloux, chair, Duncan Brown, vice chair, Nate Howard, secretary, Chris Dupuis, Charlie Plourde, Mike Tripp, alternates Tracy Harford, Wayne Tripp, and historical advisor Stan Wood.

We appreciate all your help in maintaining the Cupboard during another pandemic year. In our rural community our clients actually decreased during the pandemic as stimulus money filled some of their basic needs. Now we see more families come back to us and we welcomed 16 new families at the Cupboard.

We are serving families inside, one family at a time now that Covid is more under control. Over 2,130 bags of food were carried home. This year we served 105 Winterport and Frankfort families made up of 292 individuals. The families made a total of 862 visits. This averages out to 8 visits per family during the year. Some families need help two or three times a month. Please let your neighbors who need food help know about us! We are open at the Victoria Grant Center at the end of Park Drive in Winterport, Wednesdays, 9am to 10am, or until the last one in line is served

To the Frankfort Select Board,

This has been a good year for the Winterport Ambulance Service. We have continued to provide consistent staffing, with the majority of shifts being covered by one of our 8 Paramedics. We have also seen an increase in call volume from 494 to 591 calls. That is an increase in call volume of 16%. We have handled the increase well.

You may notice a different name on the bottom of this letter. We have gone through a change in administration. While the name may be different, the goals my predecessor set have now become my own. The continuation of our ability to take care of our citizens is our prime goal. Your support over the years has made this all possible, and we want you to share in the pride we feel working for, and being a part of this service.

As costs of doing business increase we are trying our hardest to keep our costs low. Unfortunately, some things are out of our control. Fuel for the ambulances, and medical supplies have certainly caused a strain.


Due to these factors, we are requesting \$26,000 from the town of Frankfort to be paid to the Winterport Ambulance Service. While this is an increase, the per capita charge is still vastly different between Winterport and Frankfort. With a reported population of 3963, the Winterport per capita charge is \$63.08 per person. With a reported population of 1176, and a funding request of \$26,000, the per capita charge of Frankfort will be \$22.11 per person.

This year we replaced cross culverts and driveway culverts as needed on Swanville Road. (Between Town Hill Road and North Searsport Road)

The town of Frankfort has continued to work with Kelley & Associates LLC. Attorneys to defend us in a lawsuit filed by Bangor Natural Gas Company over the taxes assessed for the use of the former government pipeline that runs from Searsport to Limestone.

The town of Frankfort is working with Stockton Springs and Winterport as a joint internet committee, researching how to bring our communities reliable high-speed internet. Representing Frankfort on the committee is Joseph Watson and William "Bill" Pupkis.

Selectboard would like to see more public input and attendance at public hearings and meetings.

We not only respond to fire calls but also accidents of all kinds, smoke and fire alarms, clearing trees and brush from roadways during storms, calls to flooded basements and roads, setting out traffic cones for hazards. Assisting Winterport or other ambulance services at accident scenes, lift assist and CPR.

With all the hazardous chemicals in so many things today, in homes and automobiles, drugs and drug labs we have to put in hours of training to be able to handle each situation. The West Frankfort Fire Dept. has our own Hazmat trained team and there are four hazmat technicians on the dept.

We now are training with Prospect Fire, Stockton Fire, Searsport Fire and Winterport Fire. These are some of the Towns we have mutual aid with and by training together it makes things go smoother at a scene. We have a monthly training schedule for different trainings and our next one is ice rescue at Swan Lake.

We have added three new interior firefighters this past year and hope to get more trained. With the high cost of everything fire dept. related we do the best we can to keep everyone trained and safe and keep everything running smoothly. Donations do help very much and we want to thank all those who have helped in the past.

In 2022 our department responded to 68 emergency calls. 11 of those calls were mutual aid calls. If you have an emergency please remember to dial 911.

There are many different jobs people can do to help at an emergency scene or around our station.

We had a very busy year working on the fire station, equipment and trucks along with training. We installed the final wider bay door on the fire station to accommodate larger fire apparatus. We purchased a 2003 Polaris Ranger 6x6 UTV and trailer that will help us respond to emergencies that are far off the road like the town forest, Mount Waldo, railroad tracks, power and gas lines, etc. We will be able to transport fire fighters and equipment much faster, easier and safer to the emergency scene. We also have Jaws of Life equipment on two of our fire trucks.

We have done monthly and annual training and equipment tests.

Our annual plant sale this year will be May 11-13 at our fire station. We are hoping for another huge turnout this year.

I want to personally thank everyone that volunteered their time and equipment to help us work on and around our station or made donations to us without putting any burden on taxpayers. There are a lot of man hours that goes into training, fighting fires, accident scenes, and maintenance on the building, equipment and trucks as well as fundraising which is greatly appreciated.

We would like to thank all our fire department members and their families, surrounding fire departments, Maine Forest Service and the citizens and businesses of Frankfort and other surrounding towns for their continued support. We were able to bring many programs to the community in 2022. Our Vietnam Veterans Celebration, Appreciation and Remembrance Day on May 22 in the Veteran's Memorial Park was a great success! We'd like to thank all who attended and donated time and resources. If you served the U.S. between 1955-1975, not only in Vietnam, and were unavailable to attend, we still have pins available. Our Summer Children's Programming, 'Oceans of Possibilities 'began Tuesday June 28th at 10:30 am and continued every Tuesday into August. We read books, played games, and participated in fun STEAM activities related to the ocean and summer. Some of the things the children enjoyed most were: making Octopus slime, Tie dyeing, homemade ice cream, imitating a scene from 'Down to the Sea with Mr. McGee' by Chris Van Dusen with the whale's spout and making boats and last but certainly not least making their own homemade ice cream!

For our Community Cafe we partnered with Waldo CAP to promote community togetherness and served lunch to children and seniors for free. Others joined in as well for a small donation to Waldo CAP for lunch. We had lots of food, activities and fun out in the sun and under our new canopies at the library!

Our book club continued and had many interesting and great discussions, which may or may not always be about the books but usually inspired nonetheless! Upcoming books are selected based on input from members. New members are welcome anytime. The group meets the last Friday of each month at 9 a.m.

We are a part of the Maine Balsam Library system, initially funded by a grant from the Stephen and Tabitha King Foundation. This means if you belong to our library, you may also get books on loan from any other Balsam Library in Maine through Interlibrary Loan, and also through most other libraries. If you have not been into the library in recent years, there has been the addition of a children's room. We have been lucky over the years with many donations of wonderful items for our genealogy room. There is so much information there, it would take a very long time to read through it all! Our cloudLibrary circulation has increased over the last year and continues to be a very useful resource to patrons, especially those with busy schedules. Once the app is downloaded, ebooks and audiobooks can be saved so the internet is not required to read/listen.

Frankfort-Stockton Springs-Winterport Broadband Committee

Dear Neighbors:

For more than a year, representatives of the towns of Frankfort, Winterport, and Stockton Springs have been meeting as a committee at the direction of our select boards to explore joint opportunities to expand high-speed broadband in our towns. Internet speed testing data show that more than 86% of locations in Frankfort are underserved, with internet download speeds less than 25 Mbps. Furthermore, many residents live in areas where there is simply no internet service available at any speed.

The severe lack of high-quality broadband infrastructure is a significant barrier for our town's success in the 21st century. Many of you have shared your stories about the challenges that our lack of broadband infrastructure causes for you and your families. During the past several years, our towns have recognized how inadequate broadband infrastructure makes it harder for businesses to expand or for new businesses to locate here. Inadequate broadband infrastructure makes it harder for our children to learn and participate in school activities and prevents residents from taking advantage of good job opportunities through teleworking. It contributes to isolation and a lack of access to telemedicine, particularly for seniors, and limits our ability to engage with online information and opportunities. It causes people to think twice about moving to or staying put in our community and makes it harder to keep in touch with distant friends and family using common technologies like video chat.

Working as a regional committee allows our three towns to collaborate and share knowledge, making us more competitive in attracting prospective internet service provider (ISP) partners and competing for state and federal grant funds. In November 2022 we issued a request for proposals to a wide range of ISPs that are active in the state, and are working through this process to identify a prospective partner for the towns to pursue grant funding through a public-private partnership.

In December 2022, all three towns submitted a joint application for the competitive "Get Ready" grant program administered by the Maine Connectivity Authority, which was established to deploy federal and state funds to ensure all Maine people have access to high-speed broadband. Our towns were selected to receive \$10,000 each for broadband planning and engagement purposes and technical assistance to build upon the committee's work over the past months.

The Get Ready program is designed to ensure our towns are prepared and well-positioned to compete for subsequent funding from the Maine Connectivity Authority to complete a broadband expansion – funding that could be available as soon as this summer. We are working hard to prepare for these once-in-a-generation opportunities, and we are committed to providing a broad, inclusive process to obtain your input throughout.

In the coming weeks, the committee will invite all residents to a series of community meetings to discuss our town's vision for improved high-speed broadband infrastructure. We hope you will join us to provide your input and participate in this important conversation about our community's future. GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the voters of the Town of Frankfort, in said County, qualified by law to vote in the Town of Frankfort, to meet at the Frankfort Town Office in said Town of Frankfort, on Thursday the 30th day of March 2023, at nine in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles to wit:

- Article 1: To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Article 2: To choose, by secret ballot, according to the Revised Statues, one Selectmen, Overseer of the Poor and Assessor for a three-year term, one Planning Board Member, three year term.
- Article 3: To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following proposal to wit: That upon completion of action on Article 2 of this Warrant, the meeting will adjourn to meet at Frankfort Church Vestry, Friday, March 31, 2023 at 7:00 pm in the forenoon, to act upon the remaining articles in this Warrant.

The polls will open at nine o'clock in the forenoon and will close at eight o'clock in the evening on the 30^{th t} day of March 2023.

- Article 4: To see if the Town will vote to increase the property tax levy limit, established for Frankfort by state law, in the event that the municipal budget approved at this town meeting will result in a tax commitment that is greater than the property tax limit. **Must vote by Secret Ballot**
- Article 5: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Municipal Officers to spend an amount not to exceed 3/12 of the budgeted amount in each budget category of the 2023 annual budget during the period from January 1, 2024 to the 2024 Annual Town Meeting, or act thereon.

- Article 21: To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to take money from the Town Forest Reserve Account to pay expenses incurred by the Town Forest Committee, or act thereon.
- Article 22: To see if the Town will vote to carry the balance of \$36,705.00 in the Town Forest Reserve Account, or act thereon.

- Article 23: To see if the Town will vote to appoint a Recreation Committee, or act thereon.
- Article 24: To see if the Town will vote to appoint a Scholarship Committee, or act thereon.
- Article 25: To see if the Town will vote to carry the balance of \$9,079.00 in the Mt. Waldo Granite Account, or act thereon.
